Student information and Behavior Agreement

RULES & RESPONSIBILITIES

The following rules have been established to ensure a safe and enjoyable educational experience for everyone on the trip. The success of this and future trips depends the behavior demonstrated by our students and staff. I expect complete compliance with the rules below.

General Rules

1. Students shall adhere to the rules set forth in the Glacier Peak High School hand book, and band hand book, at all times.
2. Students shall not purchase, seek to purchase, possess, or use alcohol, any and all illegal substances, including vaping, and/or weapons of any nature.
3. Students shall be respectful, cooperative and follow the directions of the Director, Chaperones, Tour Guides, Bus Drivers, and/or any Adult in authority.
4. Students shall refrain from public displays of affection, the use of vulgar language, and inappropriate behavior.
5. Clothing shall comply with the school dress code.
6. Students shall participate in all planned activities.
7. Students shall be on time for all departures and events. It is the students' responsibility to be present and timely for all Chaperone and GPHS Group check-ins and gatherings.
8. Students shall be personally responsible for safekeeping and management of identification, money, debit cards, tickets, cell phones, electronic devices, and meal vouchers, etc.
9. Students are responsible for managing their money to make it last for the duration of the trip. Chaperones will not give or loan money to students.
10. Be courteous to fellow band members. Be nice and look out for each other.
11. Use your best judgment at all times.
12. Represent yourself, your band, your school and your community with pride and class.

Inside the Parks

1. Students shall stay in groups of no less than 2 Glacier Peak High School students. If you see a lone band member, please invite them to join your group.
2. Students are required to check-in with a chaperone at designated times throughout the day.
3. Students shall carry Chaperone contact info (cell phone #) card at all times.
4. Use sunscreen and drink plenty of water. Eat nutritious meals. Wear sensible shoes.
5. Keep track of the time and help others keep track of time. Be on time for events, and refer to your itinerary.

6. Each Chaperone Group will enter and leave parks together. Do not exit the park without a Chaperone.
7. Students shall wear the proper uniform for each performance (polo, black shoes and socks), and travel (Grizzly band t-shirt).

Hotel

1. Members of the opposite gender are not allowed in your room. Boys *will not* enter a girl's room, and girls *will not* enter boy's rooms.
2. Students shall remain in their room following a room check each night. If there is an emergency or a student needs medical attention, contact a Chaperone.
3. Students shall be courteous and quiet in the hallways and public areas. No running, slamming doors, horseplay, etc.
4. Students shall control the volume of TV's, radios and conversations to reasonable levels.
5. Students shall leave the hotel room in the same condition as found on arrival. Students are financially responsible for any and all damage and agree to pay to repair and/or replace any and all damaged items (applies collectively to all students inhabiting the room where the damage occurred).
6. Be courteous to your roommates at all times. Disputes should be settled with the help of your Chaperone.
7. Students shall not charge calls, paid TV movies, or any other incidental charges to the rooms.
8. Students shall not give their hotel name, room number, or phone number to any non GPHS Group member.
9. Students shall not leave the grounds of Anaheim Fairfield Inn without the GPHS Group.
10. There will be no swimming allowed at any point during the trip, at our hotel or otherwise.

Consequences

The following actions may be undertaken at the discretion of the Director should any of the above rules be violated. The following consequences may be administered by the Director and/or Chaperones acting on behalf of the director:

1. Verbal reminder or reprimand;
2. Parent notification;
3. Room reassignment;
4. Student assigned to a chaperone;
5. Privileges revoked;
6. Student sent home at the earliest convenience, at parent expense with no refund of trip costs;
7. Student may face further disciplinary action at the discretion of Glacier Peak administrators;
8. Other, at the discretion of the Director.
